January 2017

Our Lodge meetings were held January 2nd and the 16th. Board of Directors and House Committee meetings were held on January 9th. During the second Lodge Meeting, Howie made a motion to purchase a new range/griddle with 2 gas convection ovens. Our current setup is failing with age and makes it very difficult to hold functions that require cooking food. Howie researched the different options available to us and found one that will fit our budget. The purchase price, freight, and installation is not to exceed \$8000. The motion was seconded and voted upon; motion passed.

The BOD and House Committee have begun the budget process for the year 2017-1018 and these meetings are held every Thursday at 6:30pm. Upon completion, it will be sent out to our members for review and will be voted on at a March meeting. Additional information will be provided as we get closer to completion.

On Sunday the 15th, Laconia Elks Lodge 876 hosted the 3rd State Elks Meeting. It was well attended with just shy of 70 officers and members present. A fabulous luncheon was prepared by Sandy Gaumond. A shout out goes to M&M Culpon and Denise Bonfiglio for helping Sandy in the kitchen to get the food out and help with the cleanup. Some of the topics discussed at the meeting were:

- Elks Scholarships-online process with a deadline of 2/1/17 for applicants.
- Copper Cannon-Peter, Camp Director, reported that there were about 85 campers/week with a total of about 489 campers who enjoyed a week of camp last season. The goal for the upcoming season is to expand the garden, install a water collection system, increase solar panels, and increase the number of youth the Elks sponsor for a week at camp. The Annual Copper Cannon Auction will be held at the Littleton Elks Lodge on March 4th. This is a good time and a great way to support Copper Cannon.
- February 5th-State Hoop Shoot is to be held in Epsom, sponsored by the Concord-Epsom Lodge #1210. We will be sending six (6) youth from the Laconia area that placed at the North District Shoot, held in Lebanon and sponsored by the Lebanon Lodge #2099, on January 8th. Actually our own Frank Mello's grandson is one of the contestants. Good Luck to all of you competing.




