Positive and uplifting comments make the Lodge a better place. Let's work hard to support one another and not tear down our fellow members!

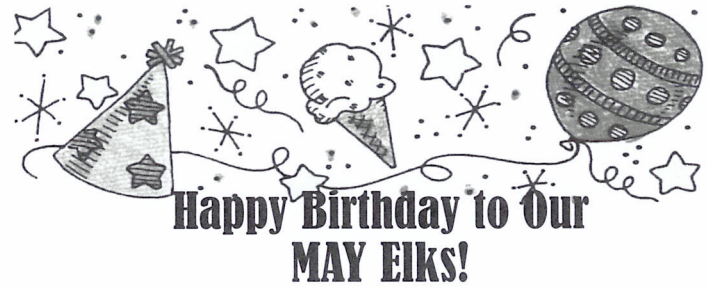
